Title VI, Part B	Small, Rural School and Low-Income School Programs.	Support rural and low-income schools.	Based on rural and low-income student populations.

Title VIII	Impact Aid.	Support schools affected by federal activities.	Varies by district impact.
McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act	Support for homeless students.	Ensure educational stability for homeless children and youth.	Distributed based on the number of homeless students.
IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act)	Special Education Grants to States.	Support special education services.	Varies; detailed allocations can be found in federal funding documents.
Project Aware and Promoting Student Resilience	Mental health and resilience programs.	Enhance student mental health and resilience.	Based on grant applications and state programs.
